AN ABUNDANT HARVEST



Fall is harvest time in this part of the world. Driving through Midwest backroads recently, my husband and I saw field after field being readied for an abundant harvest. Huge combines, windrowers, and things I really don't know the names of, rumbled down roads and in fields. The Amish, using horse-drawn hayloaders, were also busy under the blazing sun.

Regardless of the equipment used, preparing for the harvest is hard work!

"Make hay while the sun shines" is not just an old farmer's saying. It also means that when the conditions are right we should make the most of every opportunity. The same is true of sharing the Gospel.

<u>Right now</u>, the fields are "white with harvest" (John 4:35) in Greater South Asia, Mexico, and on the continent of Africa. Every week our partners share powerful stories about how God has opened *doors of opportunity* in "just the right places" to plant Gospel seeds and to reap the harvest of hearts ready to trust in Jesus.

Some regions (country names not included for security reasons) with the

greatest potential harvest are also some of the hardest in which to share the Gospel. Physical threats and travel challenges have been used to try to discourage and dissuade Gospel sharing. Yet, the Gospel is going forward boldly.

One partner working in West Africa reports that every Sunday a local group of believers would find the floor of their meeting place smeared with the excrement of sheep



and goats. Instead of retaliating, this small congregation has started building their own church, a place of worship and expanded ministry within the community.

This same partner and his team have distributed more than 800 audio Bibles in another West African country. He says, "We heard many talking about what amazing words they have heard and learned. There were many waiting and asking for more! Pray that



more and more people will hear the Word, and Faith will come!" AMEN! Would you please pray for this partner and his team whom God is using to reap a Gospel harvest?

God is using your prayers and financial support so that oncehardened hearts are now being cultivated through hearing God's Word in audio in local heart languages. MORE TEA AND STORIES



Sharing Jesus with friends and family can sometimes be intimidating. To address this, ASM Bible Engagement director Tara Rye has crafted dozens of Bible Engagement videos to help people share the Bible with others, in a natural storytelling way.

Tara says, "Telling Bible stories can open doors that may not have been opened otherwise. It

brings others into the dialogue and invites them to have a conversation." Re-telling a Bible story to someone may seem simple-but God's Word is powerful. To make sure the Bible story is passed along accurately, Tara teaches a method of hearing, telling, and re-telling it five times.

Tara not only teaches these techniques, but **she lives them out.** International students, immigrants and others are invited into her family's home regularly for tea. These often unassuming conversations about a story in the Bible have **led to hearts being opened to the Good News of Christ.** One Budhhist woman kept coming back for **"more tea and more stories"** and has since given her heart to Jesus and **is now proclaiming the Good News to her family.** She said she realized the stories teach us not about "the God of North America, ... but **this God is for ALL people!"**

BLANKETS OF COMPASSION



A new blanket. Regular visits. Prayer and medical care. Your support of ASM's Compassionate Care (CC) Team in Mozambique is providing these things (and more) for people's bodies AND souls, bringing practical help and spiritual hope to someone like Celestino (pictured, left).

Celestino was sleeping in his house, cold air blowing through the gaps of the bamboo, mud and thatch that make up the walls. Because of the 10°C (50°F) winter weather, he kept a fire burning in a firepit in the middle of his

small room. As Celestino moved nearer the fire for warmth in his sleep, his blanket and pant leg caught on fire, causing **severe burns on his whole leg.** The CC Team visited him a week later to dress his burns and give him the treatment and medicine he needed to heal properly. The team also taught Celestino's neighbor how to dress the wounds and care for him until the

The team gave Celestino a new fire-resistant wool blanket from the 2021 Mozambique Container (thank you again for making that possible!). Not only is Celestino now supplied with the life-giving medicine he needs to recover from his severe injuries, he has also been given the Word of Life in an audio Bible. While he remains bedridden for a few months, he'll be able to listen to God's sweet Word in his heart language. Thank you!
